**\*\*After the message** we invite you to take **communion** with us – Stations are located near each exit. This is a tradition long practiced by followers of Jesus (see 1 Corinthians 11:23-26). At The Net we take communion by dipping bread (representing Christ's body) into a bowl of juice (representing Christ's blood) and eating it. This practice is called intinction. We also invite you to receive **prayer** during this part of our service. Leaders

available to pray with you will be standing near the cross and communion station.

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
