****After the message** we invite you to take communion with us – A station is located near the cross. This is a tradition long practiced by followers of Jesus (see 1 Corinthians 11:23-26). At The Net we take communion by dipping bread (representing Christ's body) into a bowl of juice (representing Christ's blood) and eating it. This practice is called intinction. We also invite you to receive prayer during this part of our service. Leaders available to pray with you will be standing near the cross and communion station.

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
