James 1:25 – But the one who looks intently into the perfect law of freedom and perseveres in it, and is not a forgetful hearer but a doer who works—this person will be blessed in what he does.

John 8:31-32 – Then Jesus said to the Jews who had believed him, "If you continue in my word, you really are my disciples. You will know the truth, and the truth will set you free."

Hebrews 8:10 – For this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the Lord: I will put my laws into their minds and write them on their hearts. I will be their God, and they will be my people.

2 Corinthians 3:2-3, 17 – You yourselves are our letter, written on our hearts, known and read by everyone. You show that you are Christ's letter, delivered by us, not written with ink but with the Spirit of the living God—not on tablets of stone but on tablets of human hearts. Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom.

****After the message** we invite you to take **communion** with us – Stations are located near each exit. This is a tradition long practiced by followers of Jesus (see 1 Corinthians 11:23-26). At The Net we take communion by dipping bread (representing Christ's body) into a bowl of juice (representing Christ's blood) and eating it. This practice is called intinction. We also invite you to receive **prayer** during this part of our service. Leaders available to pray with you can be identified by their lanyards and will be standing in the auditorium at the lower exit to your left.

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
